OF FLORIDA UNITED FURRY FANDOM, INC.**

**ARTICLE I
NAME**

The name of the corporation is Florida United Furry Fandom, Inc. (the "Organization"). It is organized under the Florida Not for Profit Corporation Action (the "Act").

**ARTICLE II

**ARTICLE III

(b) In furtherance of this purpose, the Organization will organize and operate a yearly convention to bring together enthusiasts of anthropomorphism, which may include activities such as seminars, forums, discussion groups, as well as anthropomorphic performances.

(c) On an annual basis, the Organization will donate a portion of its net earnings to an organization(s) that (i) qualifies as an exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and (ii) promotes and/or supports, either directly or indirectly, the care of and/or prevention of cruelty to animals. The Directors will select the organization(s) to which such funds are donated.

(d) No part of the net earnings of the Organization shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the Organization shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth herein. No substantial part of the activities of the Organization shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Organization shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, this corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that aren't in furtherance of the purposes of this corporation.

(e) Upon the dissolution of the Organization, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE IV BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The affairs of the Organization will be managed by a Board of Directors of not less than three (3) persons. The method of election of directors shall be as stated in the bylaws of the Organization.

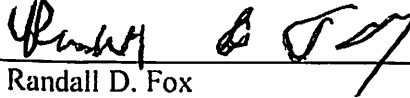

**BYLAWS
OF
FLORIDA UNITED FURRY FANDOM, INC.
A Florida Not For Profit Corporation**

**ARTICLE I
OFFICES**

The Corporation will have such offices, within or without the State of Florida, as the Board of Directors determines from time to time.

**ARTICLE II
MEMBERS**

The Corporation shall not have members. All rights granted to members under law shall be vested in the members of the Board of Directors.

**ARTICLE III
DIRECTORS**

Section 3.1. **FUNCTION.** All corporate powers will be exercised by or under the authority of the Board of Directors. The business and affairs of the Corporation will be managed under the direction of the Board of Directors.

Section 3.2. **QUALIFICATION.** Directors must be natural persons who are 18 years of age or older but need not be residents of Florida.

Section 3.3. **NUMBER.** The Corporation has seven (7) directors. The number of directors may be increased or decreased from time to time by adoption of a resolution by the Board of Directors but shall at all times never be less than three (3). Unless the Board of Directors remove a director or directors, a decrease in the number of directors will not shorten the current term of any incumbent director.

Section 3.4. **ELECTION AND TERM.**

a. **Initial Board.** Each person named in the Articles of Incorporation as a member of the Board of Directors will hold office until the next annual meeting of the Board of Directors and until such person's successor is elected and qualified or until such person's earlier resignation, removal from office, or death.

b. **Annual Election of Board.** At each annual meeting of the Board of Directors, the incumbent Board of Directors will elect a successor Board of Directors by plurality vote. Each director so elected will hold office until the next succeeding annual meeting and until such director's successor has been elected and qualified or until such director's earlier resignation, removal from office, or death.

c. **Election of Chair of Board.** The Board may elect a Chair, and if one is elected, the Chair will preside at all meetings of the directors and will have such other duties as may from time to time be prescribed by the Board of Directors.

Section 3.5. REMOVAL, RESIGNATION, AND VACANCIES.

a. **Removal.** Any director may be removed, with or without cause, by majority action of the Board of Directors. A director will be removed if the number of votes cast to remove the director exceeds the number of votes cast not to remove the director. The notice of the meeting at which a vote is taken to remove a director will state that the purpose or one of the purposes of the meeting is the removal of a director or directors. In the event that any one or more directors is removed, new directors may be elected at the same meeting.

b. **Resignation.** A director may resign at any time by delivering written notice to the Board of Directors or its Chair or to the Corporation. Resignation of any director shall take effect when the notice is delivered unless the notice specifies a later effective date, in which event Board may fill the pending vacancy before the effective date if they provide that the successor does not take office until the effective date.

c. **Method of Filling Vacancies.** Any vacancy occurring in the Board of Directors, including any vacancy created by reason of an increase in the number of directors, may be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the remaining directors, though less than a quorum of the Board of Directors. A director elected to fill a vacancy shall hold office until such director's successor has been elected and qualified or until such director's earlier resignation, removal from office, or death.

Section 3.6. QUORUM AND VOTING. A majority of the number of directors prescribed by these Bylaws constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business, provided, however, that whenever, for any reason, a vacancy occurs in the Board of Directors, a quorum shall consist of a majority of the remaining directors until the vacancy has been filled. If a quorum is present when a vote is taken, the affirmative vote of a majority of directors present is an act of the Board of Directors.

Section 3.7. TIME OF ANNUAL, REGULAR, AND SPECIAL MEETINGS. An annual meeting of the Board of Directors will be held each year, and regular meetings may be held at such times thereafter as the Board of Directors may fix. Special meetings may be held at such times as called by the Chair of the Board, the President of the Corporation, or any two directors.

Section 3.8. NOTICE OF MEETINGS. Annual and regular meetings of the Board of Directors may be held without notice of the date, time, place or purpose of the meeting, other than the resolution or resolutions fixing the schedule of such meetings. At least two days before a special meeting, written notice of the time and place of such meeting of the Board of Directors will be given to each director in person or by first-class mail, facsimile, or other electronic transmission. If mailed, the notice of any special meeting shall be deemed to be delivered on the second day after it is deposited in the United States mail, so addressed, with postage prepaid.

Section 3.9. WAIVER OF NOTICE. Notice of a meeting of the Board of Directors need not be given to any director who signs a waiver of notice either before, during, or after the meeting. Attendance of a director at a meeting constitutes a waiver of notice of such meeting and waiver of any and all objections to the place of the meeting, the time of the meeting, or the manner in which it has been called or convened, except when a director states, at the beginning of the meeting or promptly upon arrival at the meeting, any objection to the transaction of business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened.

Section 3.10. PRESUMPTION OF ASSENT. A director of the Corporation who is present at a meeting of the Board of Directors or a committee of the Board of Directors when corporate action is taken is presumed to have assented to the action unless such director votes against it or expressly abstains from voting on the action taken, or, such director objects at the beginning of the meeting to the holding of the meeting or transacting specific business at the meeting.

Section 3.11. PARTICIPATION IN MEETING BY CONFERENCE CALL OR SIMILAR ELECTRONIC MEANS. Members of the Board of Directors may participate in a meeting of the Board by conference telephone or similar means of communication through which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other at the same time. Participation by such means shall constitute presence in person at a meeting.

Section 3.12. ACTION WITHOUT A MEETING. Any action required or permitted to be taken at a Board of Directors' meeting or a meeting of a committee of the Board of Directors may be taken without a meeting if: (a) each of the directors, or each of the members of the committee, as the case may be, consents in writing to the action; (b) the consent sets forth the action to be taken; and (c) the consent is filed in the minutes of the proceedings of the Board or of the committee. The consents may consist of one or more writings and such written consents will have the same effect as a unanimous meeting vote. Action taken under this section is effective when the last director signs the consent, unless the consent specifies a different effective date. A consent signed under this section shall have the effect of a meeting vote and may be described as such in any document.

Section 3.13. COMPENSATION. The Board of Directors has the authority to fix the compensation, if any, of directors. Nothing in these Bylaws precludes any director from serving this Corporation in any other capacity and receiving proper compensation for such service.

Section 3.14. DIRECTOR CONFLICTS OF INTEREST. No contract or other transaction between the Corporation and one or more of its directors or any other corporation, firm, association, or entity in which one or more of its directors are directors or officers or are financially interested will be either void or voidable because of such relationship or interest, because such director or directors are present at the meeting of the Board of Directors or a committee thereof which authorizes, approves, or ratifies such contract or transaction, or because the votes of such director or directors are counted for such purpose, if:

- (a) the fact of such relationship or interest is disclosed or known to the Board of Directors or committee which authorizes, approves, or ratifies the contract or

transaction by a vote or consent sufficient for the purpose without counting the votes or consents of such interested directors, all in the manner provided by law; or

(b) the contract or transaction is fair and reasonable as to the Corporation at the time it is authorized by the Board or a committee.

Section 3.15. **DUTIES OF DIRECTORS.** A director will perform the duties of director, including the duties as a member of any committee of the Board upon which such director serves, in good faith, in a manner reasonably believed to be in the best interest of the Corporation, and with such care as an ordinarily prudent person in a like position would use under similar circumstances.

ARTICLE IV EXECUTIVE AND OTHER COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 4.1. **CREATION; APPLICABLE REQUIREMENTS.** The Board of Directors, by resolution adopted by a majority of the full Board of Directors, may designate from among its members an executive committee and one or more other committees each of which, to the extent provided in the resolution, has and may exercise all the authority of the Board of Directors, except as prohibited by Section 607.0825(1), Florida Statutes. All requirements applying to the Board of Directors regarding meetings, notice, waiver of notice, quorum and voting apply to committees and their members as well.

Section 4.2. **NUMBER OF MEMBERS; DESIGNATION OF ALTERNATES.** Each committee will have two or more members who serve at the pleasure of the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors, by resolution adopted in accordance with this section, may designate one or more directors as alternate members of any such committee, who may act in the place and stead of any absent member or members at any meeting of such committee.

Section 4.3. **DIRECTOR'S DUTY REMAINS.** Neither the creation of any committee, the delegation of authority to any committee, nor action by any committee will alone constitute compliance by any director not a member of such committee with such director's obligation to act in good faith, in a manner reasonably believed to be in the best interest of the corporation, and with such care as an ordinarily prudent person in a like position would use under similar circumstances.

ARTICLE V OFFICERS

Section 5.1. **OFFICERS.** The officers of the Corporation will consist of a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and any other officers and assistant officers as may be deemed necessary. The initial officers are listed in the Articles of Incorporation. Successor officers will be elected at the annual meeting of the Board of Directors in each year or at any special meeting called for such purpose. The Board from time to time may elect or appoint other officers and assistant officers who will have the authority and perform the duties prescribed by the Board. An elected or duly appointed President or Vice President may, in turn, appoint one or more assistant Secretaries or assistant Treasurers, unless the Board of Directors disapproves or rejects the

appointment. All officers will hold office until their successors have been appointed and have qualified or until their earlier resignation, removal from office, or death. One person may simultaneously hold any two or more offices.

Section 5.2. **DUTIES.** The following officers of this Corporation will have the following duties:

a. **President.** The President will be the chief executive officer of the Corporation and will, subject to the directions of the Board of Directors, generally supervise and control all of the business and affairs of the Corporation. In the absence of a Chair of the Board of Directors, the President will also preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors. In addition, the president shall possess, and may exercise, such power and authority, and shall perform such duties, as may from time to time be assigned to him or her by the board of directors, and as are incident to the offices of president and chief executive officer.

b. **Vice President.** Each Vice President, if one or more is elected, will have such powers and perform such duties as may, from time to time, be prescribed by the Board of Directors or by the President. In the event of the absence or disability of the President, the Vice President or Vice Presidents will succeed to the President's power and duties in the order designated by the Board of Directors.

c. **Secretary.** The Secretary will attend all meetings of the Board of Directors, record all proceedings of such meetings in the minute book of the Corporation, see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these bylaws or as required by law, and authenticate records of the Corporation. The Secretary will perform such other duties as may, from time to time, be prescribed by the Board of Directors or by the President.

d. **Treasurer.** The Treasurer will (i) have charge and custody of and be responsible for all funds and securities of the Corporation, (ii) keep full and accurate accounts of receipts and disbursements, (iii) receive and give receipts for monies due and payable to the Corporation, and deposit monies in the name of the Corporation in the depositories designated by the Board of Directors, and (iv) perform all other duties as may, from time to time, be prescribed by the Board of Directors or the President.

Section 5.3. **REMOVAL, RESIGNATION AND VACANCIES.**

a. **Removal.** Any officer elected or appointed by the Board of Directors and any assistant officer appointed by another officer may be removed by the Board at any time with or without cause. Any assistant officer, if appointed by the President or a Vice President, may likewise be removed by such officer with or without cause.

b. **Resignation.** An officer may resign at any time by delivering notice to the Corporation. A resignation is effective when the notice is delivered unless the notice specifies a later effective date. If a resignation is made effective at a later date and the

corporation accepts the future effective date, the Board of Directors may fill the pending vacancy before the effective date if the board provides that the successor does not take office until the effective date.

c. **Method of Filling Vacancies.** Any vacancy, however occurring, in any office may be filled by the Board of Directors.

Section 5.4. **COMPENSATION.** The Board of Directors from time to time will fix the salaries, if any, of the officers. The President has the authority to fix the salaries of all employees of the Corporation other than officers elected or appointed by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VI BOOKS AND RECORDS

The Corporation will maintain: minutes of the proceedings of its Board of Directors and committees of directors; accurate accounting records; a copy of the current Articles of Incorporation and bylaws of the Corporation; a list of the names and business addresses of the current officers and directors of the Corporation; and a copy of the most recent annual report for the Corporation as filed with the Secretary of State.

ARTICLE VII CORPORATE SEAL

The Board of Directors may adopt a corporate seal which has the name of the Corporation inscribed thereon, and such seal may be a facsimile, engraved, printed, or impression seal; provided, however, that in any event, the affixation of such seal shall not be required to authorize or validate any document entered into or adopted by the Corporation.

ARTICLE VIII PROHIBITION AGAINST SHARING IN CORPORATE EARNINGS

No officer, Director, or member of a sub-committee, or person connected with the Corporation, or any other private individual shall receive at any time any of the net earnings or pecuniary profit from the operations of the Corporation, provided that this prohibition shall not prevent the payment to any such person of such reasonable compensation for services rendered to or for the Corporation in effecting any of its purposes as shall be fixed by the Board of Directors; and no such person or persons shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets upon the dissolution of the Corporation. Upon such dissolution or winding up of the affairs of the Corporation, whether voluntary or involuntary, the assets of the Corporation, after all debts have been satisfied, then remaining in the hands of the Board of Directors shall be distributed, transferred, conveyed, delivered, and paid over, in such amounts as the Board of Directors may determine or as may be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction, exclusively to charitable, religious, scientific, testing for public safety, literary, or educational organizations which qualify under the provisions of Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that any distributions upon

dissolution of this Corporation shall be to and for the exempt purposes of this Corporation as enumerated in the Articles of Incorporation of this Corporation.

ARTICLE IX EXEMPT ACTIVITIES

Notwithstanding any other provision of these Bylaws, no officer, Director or representative of this Corporation shall take any action or carry on any activity by or on behalf of the Corporation not permitted to be taken or carried on by an organization exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, and the regulations promulgated thereunder as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended, or by an organization contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of such Code and regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.

ARTICLE X AMENDMENT

These Bylaws may be amended or repealed and additional bylaws adopted, in writing, by the Board of Directors.

9a. The website provided in this response currently belongs to Pawpet Live Experiences, Inc. ("Pawpet"). As explained in greater detail, below, FLUFF, is a successor to Pawpet and is the intended donee of Pawpet's property, including, but not limited to, its website.

Part IV

Description of Activities

FLUFF was formed to take over operations of the Megaplex Anthropomorphic Convention (the "Convention"). The Convention is held annually, generally in August, in Orlando, Florida. The Convention operations are currently run by Pawpet. However, beginning with the 2019 Convention, which will be held in August 2019 (exact dates to be determined), FLUFF will handle all aspects of operations of the Convention.

FLUFF's operations will include all aspects of running the Convention. FLUFF will plan the Convention. This primarily includes negotiating and entering into agreements with vendors to provide Convention services, such as venue, food and beverage, exhibits, entertainment, and activities for attendees. FLUFF will also handle all Convention operations, including collecting funds generated from the Convention, paying vendors, managing the accounting and finances of the Convention, and maintaining the books and records of the Convention.

FLUFF's primary source of funding will be through the sale of registrations to the Convention ("Registrations"). Funds generated from the sale of Registrations will further FLUFF's exempt purpose by enabling FLUFF to organize the Convention and arrange for inclusion of anthropomorphic art exhibits and performances at the Convention for enjoyment by Convention registrants. The Convention furthers FLUFF's exempt purpose by providing a forum for attendees to gather to experience, share, and celebrate anthropomorphic arts, including performing arts, such as costuming, improv, and musical performances, as well as visual arts, such as cartoons, sketches, photography, and digital design. Registration for the Convention is open to members of the public.

The Convention also has a history of promoting awareness of and supporting animal-related causes. For example, the Convention's mascot is the Florida Panther, an endangered species of cougar whose habitat is predominantly located in Florida. Additionally, the Convention has maintained a longstanding relationship with The CARE Foundation, a 501(c)(3) non-profit located in Apopka, Florida that rescues exotic animals and educates the public on conservation and current environmental issues concerning endangered and threatened species. The Convention has raised over \$50,000 for The CARE Foundation over the years by including special fundraising events at the Convention, such as poker tournaments and auctions. Additionally, the Convention often includes exhibits and educational panels by The CARE Foundation, and The CARE Foundation often brings to the Convention live animals from its animal sanctuary. By including exhibits and educational panels such as this, the Convention raises public awareness and promotes public appreciation and support of animal causes.

At this time, FLUFF will spend essentially all of its time operating the Convention. However, in the future, FLUFF may develop new events and fundraising strategies to further its purpose to promote anthropomorphic arts and provide financial support to animal-related causes.

2b. Business Relationship with Officer/Director.

FLUFF intends to sublease from Director, Paul James Hahn, Jr., storage space within a warehouse leased by Mr. Hahn. FLUFF will pay to Mr. Hahn \$250 per month for use of the subleased portion of the warehouse. FLUFF will use the subleased portion of the warehouse for storage of audio/visual equipment, props, and other items used for the Convention (See response to Part IV, above, for information concerning the Convention).

FLUFF has investigated alternative storage options, such as storage unit rentals, and believes the sublease with Mr. Hahn is advantageous to FLUFF in that it is climate controlled and costs less than comparable storage units that FLUFF could rent from third parties. Additionally, FLUFF is able to use the address of the warehouse space for purposes of insuring its property; FLUFF has been unable to find any third-party storage facility that was willing to permit use of its address for FLUFF's insurance purposes, so this is an important feature. Lastly, there is room at this warehouse facility for FLUFF to expand its subleased portion in the event that it needs additional space in the future.

There is no written sublease yet, and, therefore, a copy has not been provided.

5b and c. Conflict of Interest Policy. FLUFF's board of directors is reviewing the conflict of interest policy attached as Appendix A to the Form 1023 Instructions and plans to adopt it or a similar policy that is consistent with that policy.

7a. Occasionally, FLUFF may purchase goods, services, or assets from officers or directors if (i) the good, service, or asset will benefit FLUFF, and (ii) the price is fair and reasonable. In order to determine whether the price is fair and reasonable, the board will research alternative pricing through third parties such as retailers and secondhand sellers (e.g., Craigslist, Ebay, etc.).

7b. Occasionally, FLUFF may sell goods or assets to officers or directors if (i) the good or asset is no longer needed by or useful to FLUFF, and (ii) the price is fair and reasonable. In order to determine whether the price is fair and reasonable, the board will research alternative pricing through third parties such as retailers and secondhand sellers (e.g., Craigslist, Ebay, etc.).

Part VI

1a. As set forth in Part IV, above, FLUFF will sell to individuals registrations to the Convention.

1b. FLUFF intends to donate a portion of its net earnings to an exempt 501(c)(3) non-profit entity (or entities) that promotes and/or supports, either directly or indirectly, the care of and/or prevention of cruelty to animals.

Part VIII

4a and d. At this time, FLUFF does not have any specific fundraising programs in place or planned; however, FLUFF anticipates that, in the future, it may solicit donations via email campaigns and its website. Additionally, in the past, there has been an in person fundraising initiative at the Convention which Pawpet referred to as the "Bucket Brigade." For this program, Pawpet would scatter collection buckets throughout the Convention areas so that attendees could donate funds to The CARE Foundation. FLUFF anticipates that it will continue the "Bucket Brigade" program in the future when it takes over operations of the Convention. Pawpet has also conducted charity auctions at past Conventions, where people donated goods or services that were auctioned off to highest bidder for charity. This is another fundraising program that FLUFF may elect to continue in the future. Instead of raising funds for the benefit of The CARE Foundation as past fundraising programs have done, future fundraising programs will be done for the purpose of raising funds for the benefit of FLUFF, except that some portion of funds raised by FLUFF may be donated by FLUFF to another organization pursuant to Article 3(c) of FLUFF's Articles of Incorporation.

10. FLUFF will own any and all intellectual property incidental to and/or associated with the Convention, including copyrights, trade names, trademarks, etc. This intellectual property will be

for FLUFF's exclusive use; therefore, there will be no fees charged. The intellectual property will be used in connection with the Convention, including marketing activities, publications, the Convention website, etc.

11. Pawpet intends to donate and transfer to FLUFF any and all of its property, including, but not limited to, all intellectual property associated with the Convention, such as copyrights, trade names, trademarks, etc. There will not be any conditions or agreements imposed on this donation.

13b. FLUFF intends to make donations to other 501(c)(3) exempt entities. FLUFF has established in Article 3(b) of its Articles of Incorporation that it will "donate a portion of its net earnings to an organization(s) that (i) qualifies as an exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and (ii) promotes and/or supports, either directly or indirectly, the care of and/or prevention of cruelty to animals." This practice will further one of FLUFF's exempt purposes stated in Article 3(a)(ii) to "promote appreciation and preservation of, and prevent cruelty to, animals, wildlife, and the environment."

13d. At this time, the only known organization that FLUFF may donate funds to is The CARE Foundation. This is an organization that FLUFF's predecessor, Pawpet, has donated to in the past. There is no relationship between FLUFF and The CARE Foundation or between Pawpet and The CARE Foundation. It is merely an organization whose exempt activities coincide with Pawpet's and FLUFF's charitable objectives. Additional organizations may be identified in the future provided that they meet the criteria in Article 3(b) of FLUFF's Articles of Incorporation.

13e. FLUFF will retain any receipts it is provided for donations made to organizations. Also, FLUFF uses Quickbooks accounting software and will record any donations into the accounting software.

13 f and g. FLUFF's selection criteria are set for in Article 3(c) of its Articles of Incorporation, which state: "On an annual basis, the Organization will donate a portion of its net earnings to an organization(s) that (i) qualifies as an exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and (ii) promotes and/or supports, either directly or indirectly, the care of and/or prevention of cruelty to animals. The Directors will select the organization(s) to which such funds are donated."

Part IX

23. The 2017 Profit and Loss statement of Pawpet is attached hereto as **Exhibit A** to demonstrate the itemized expenses that FLUFF anticipates it will incur.

Schedule G

1a and b.

Florida United Furry Fandom, Inc. (“FLUFF”) was formed to take over planning and operations of the Megaplex Anthropomorphic Convention (the “Convention”). The Convention is held annually, generally in August, in Orlando, Florida. The Convention operations are currently run by Pawpet Live Experiences, Inc. (“Pawpet”). Pawpet’s control and operation of the Convention will conclude following completion of the 2018 Convention which is scheduled to take place August 3 – 5, 2018. Beginning with the 2019 Convention, which will be held in August 2019, FLUFF will take over planning and operations for the Convention.

Pawpet was organized as a corporation under the Florida Business Corporation Act. Additionally, Pawpet has, at all relevant times, been taxed as a for-profit entity. However, at all relevant times, Pawpet has operated more like a non-profit entity. Although Pawpet has shareholders, the shareholders do not receive, nor have they ever received, profit distributions. Rather, the shareholders have merely existed out of necessity due to the organizational constraints of the Florida Business Corporation Act. At all relevant times, the shareholders’ function has been to serve as the governing body of Pawpet, much like a board of directors of a nonprofit entity.

Additionally, Pawpet’s sole purpose has always been to plan and operate the Convention. The purpose of the Convention is charitable in that it is intended to educate the public on matters related to anthropomorphism in order to foster an appreciation of anthropomorphic arts and performance. In terms of finances, the objective of the Convention is not to generate profits, but rather to generate enough revenue to cover the expenses of the Convention and also establish reserves to help grow the Convention with every succeeding year. Over the years, Pawpet and the

Convention have also developed a secondary purpose of raising awareness of, and funds for, conservation and animal-related issues.

In light of the above-described circumstances, Pawpet's board of directors determined that the objectives of the Convention would be better served by a non-profit entity. Following the conclusion of the 2018 Convention, Pawpet intends to donate and transfer to FLUFF any and all of its property, including, but not limited to, all intellectual property associated with the Convention.

An itemization of the assets which FLUFF anticipates it will receive from Pawpet is attached as **Exhibit B**.

8. FLUFF will take over the sublease that currently exists between Paul James Hahn, Jr. and Pawpet. See response to Part V, Question 2, for detailed explanation of the sublease. The sublease has never been reduced to writing; therefore, no copy is provided.
